

Letter from Lori Kennedy,

North Texas Area Community Health Centers Board President:

Integrated care. It was the theme for the 2023 NTACHC conference, and it has continued to be a theme with our three centers.



Our patients receive excellent care from our providers from the time they step inside to their appointments and after they leave. We call it integrated care because their care is interconnected—from the front desk to the providers to the resources. We make sure they receive the wrap-around services to help them get healthy or keep them healthy.

Let me illustrate this point. A patient comes in to get her diabetes checked. She receives medicine and a monitor for her to check her glucose levels at home. Our staff can check those glucose levels and communicate with her. The provider believes the patient can benefit from the "Living Your Best Life" program, which helps teach people healthy lifestyle choices, so that provider enrolls her. In addition, the provider sees that this patient has not gotten an eye exam lately, so she is referred to the Northside Eye Care Center with an appointment we help her make. Since diabetes can affect your eyesight and cause blindness, we are concerned that our patient needs to get an eye exam. The patient mentions that her daughter is pregnant and has not seen a doctor. The provider tells her to have her daughter make an appointment right away.

This scenario is an example of how we provide integrated care for our patients. As a bonus, we often have family members come to NTACHC because another family member already sees us and trusts us.

NTACHC prides itself on making sure we are taking care of our patients at our three centers. We are improving the health and wellness of each patient through our accessible, compassionate and quality healthcare services.

We hope this report shows how we're taking care of our community and what we've done the past few years.

NTACHC Provides COVID and Flu Shots


Over the past few years, we have provided COVID vaccinations and flu shots for the community.

North Texas Area Community Health Centers Host Two Nationally Prominent Doctors to Discuss Infant and Maternal Mortality

On Aug. 8-9, 2022, we hosted an important discussion about maternal and infant mortality with Dr. Virginia Caine of the Marion County Public Health Department, and Dr. Haywood Brown of University of South Florida. Heads of hospitals, leading OB/GYN providers, residents, elected officials and leaders attended to learn how we can implement strategies in Tarrant County.



Dr. Virginia Caine presented on "Maternal and Infant Mortality: Making the Case to Change the Paradigm for Health Disparities." "I think that we have seen a tremendous amount of reduction in infant deaths and maternal mortality in Tarrant County. A lot of work has been done in the last five years, and we're continuing to see a decline, but we still have too many babies dying. And even one mother dying is too much."

<u>Dr. Haywood Brown</u> spoke about "Achieving Health Equity in the Vulnerable Maternal Child Population." In his hospitals, he has implemented a program called the fourth trimester to help moms who have just given birth with postpartum checkups.

Northside Eye Care Center Helps Five-Year-Old See Clearly

A special thanks to <u>Communities Foundation of Texas</u> for awarding North Texas Area Community Health Centers a grant from their recent health-focused funding cycle to provide Northside Eye Care Center with pediatric eye care services. Here's a story of how this grant is helping one of our youngest patients.

Helping people with their eyesight is a passion of Dr. Mary Kate Walters, director of Northside Eye Care Center and professor of practice with University of Houston College of Optometry. She and her team are committed to helping people see clearly.



Dr. Walters met Ximena, a precious five-year-old who had trouble seeing. During this past academic year, Ximena's mom, Keyla, received a letter from her daughter's school stating that she had recently failed an eye exam. Though Ximena was provided with corrective lenses at the time of the exam, Keyla was still concerned.

Keyla quickly contacted her insurance provider to schedule a more comprehensive exam as soon as possible at a nearby facility. Keyla was referred to Northside's Eye Care Center, which is conveniently located close to her home. The facility also accepted her insurance, which had been an issue with a few other places. She was surprised to find that the Northside Eye Care Center offered an array of services, ranging from routine eye care to comprehensive medical exams, for patients of all ages using state-of-the-art equipment and technology.

At the appointment, Ximena received a thorough examination and was provided with a more appropriate lens prescription. They were even able to easily switch out the lenses on Ximena's original pair of frames. Keyla was relieved that her daughter got the help she needed and is glad to know that Ximena will be able to see more clearly. Keyla stated that working the team "has been great. Ximena loves it there!" Keyla also recommends Northside Eye Care Center as there's a "great group of doctors" ready to help.

Northside Eye Care Center is located on the second floor of North Texas Area Community Health Centers (NTACHC) located at 2332 Beverly Drive in Fort Worth. Northside Eye Care Center's team is accepting new patients and provides pediatric eye exams, diabetic eye exams and treatment for glaucoma, cataracts and red eyes. 


North Texas Area Community Health Centers Helps Jose Manage His Diabetes

Jose had been struggling with diabetes for years, trying to find ways to control his glucose levels. He had been to many different doctors and clinics, but none of them had ever made him feel heard or truly cared about his health problems. That all changed when he was referred to North Texas Area Community Health Centers (NTACHC) by the Refugee and Immigrant Center for Education and Legal Services (RAICES).

At his first appointment, Jose was amazed. Not only did he feel welcomed and heard, but the cost of care was far more affordable than most of the other options he had tried in the past. He was also referred to the Living Your Best Life (LYBL) program, which taught him how to make healthy changes to his lifestyle and diet that would help him lower his glucose levels. LYBL is an NTACHC program in which providers refer patients needing counseling to help get their diabetes and high blood pressure under control.

Jose was also able to take advantage of new technologies that helped him monitor his blood pressure remotely. The remote blood pressure monitoring cuff allowed Jose to take his reading and instantly transmit the data to a secure portal where his healthcare providers were able to review it in real-time. But even more important was the care he received from the staff at NTACHC. Gaby, Carmen



and Mary Lou were instrumental in helping him make the changes that would improve his health.

Carmen said, "A patient's overall wellness is our priority. We wanted to make sure Jose truly felt that we care for him and take his health seriously."

Thanks to the help of the staff at NTACHC and the Living Your Best Life program, Jose was able to lower his glucose levels and feel better than ever before. He was so impressed with his care that he recommended NTACHC to several of his friends. He was confident that anyone who sought care at NTACHC would be in good hands.




"This has helped me a lot," Jose said. "I tell everyone I know about NTACHC and the amazing care they provide, and the affordable cost of medications."


Jose was grateful he had been referred to NTACHC and was glad he finally found a center that was willing to take care of him and make sure he was living his best life.

Age of Patients





Number of Male and Female Patients
